Demographer's view

- Demography is the study of the size, distribution and composition of populations, and the processes that change populations over time (i.e., fertility, mortality and migration)
- Demography provides the empirical foundation on which other social sciences are built (Xie 2000).




Aspects of human society that vary by age and sex

Demographic	Social	Economic
Dying	Getting married/divorced	Being in the labor force
Being sexually active	Being involved in religious organizations and activity	Occupation within the labor force
Having a baby	School enrollment	Current income
Moving or migrating	Level of educational attainment	Level of accumulated wealth




Population ageing in Australia, 1961-2011





....population ageing is expected to continue well beyond 2011




Growth in the 65 + population projected to be twice as much a growth in the under 65 population


National averages mask differences within Australia


Queanbeyan 2011

Population ageing is complex across local government areas







Sources of population ageing

- Increased longevity
- Sustained low fertility (near / below replacement)
- Net out-migration of young adults
- Net in-migration of elderly
- Net immigration of elderly


Forecasted age composition for the UK, 2024










Components of decadal U.S. foreign-born elderly population change
